SELEGER MOOR VISIT

Over 30 members and their guests spent a very pleasant evening walking around the Seleger Moor gardens in Rifferswil on 27th May. Seleger Moor was founded by Robert Seleger in 1953 and is not only the best and most famous specialist Rhododendron garden in Switzerland, but renowned throughout Europe.

We were fortunate to have as our guides one of our own IMCZ members Roland Dunner who works at the gardens, and his colleague, and the Head Gardener, Reto Kurz. After a courtesy apero, we enjoyed a barbeque and an introductory talk on the gardens from Roland. We then split up into two groups headed by Roland and Reto for a very informative guided tour of the gardens.

The threatened rain managed to stay away and a very enjoyable time was had by all as we took in the stunningly colourful views of the azalea and rhododendron blooms in their natural surroundings.

I must confess to not having realised that gardens of the standard of Seleger Moor are on our doorstep, just across the 'border' into Kanton Zürich. I can heartily recommend a visit there, especially to see the rhododendrons. However, you need to be quick, the blooms don't last too long!

Entrance to Seleger Moor costs just 5 SFR and the gardens can be found by following the signs through Rifferswil from Metmenstetten, or alternatively, from Hausen am Albis.


