On Sunday July 4 IMCZ members and families are once again heading off into the outback in the hunt for GOLD. Our last 'gold rush' was way back in 1993 and a jolly good day it proved to be. The history of gold panning in Switzerland goes back a 1000 years and the gold found is very pure.

All participants should come complete with wellington's and a waterproof jacket. Wellington's because in true tradition you will be 'standing' in a very shallow stream doing your gold panning.

The plan is that we meet in the car park of HASLE (LU) Bahnhof at latest 10.00 hrs. You will met there by David HARRIS who will guide you over the next 9 km to the Hotel Bergruh, Bramboden. This part of the route is over narrow white roads. On arrival at the Hotel Bergruh you will have the choice of parking your car and making a 20 minute walk to the panning site OR doubling up in cars for the final part of the route. Parking at the actual panning site is limited.

The Hotel Bergruh offers toilet facilities and, if the need arises, a place to change at the end of the day.

Whilst the stream is very shallow parents with very small children are requested to monitor the safety of their children.

The program finishes at approx. 16.00 hrs.

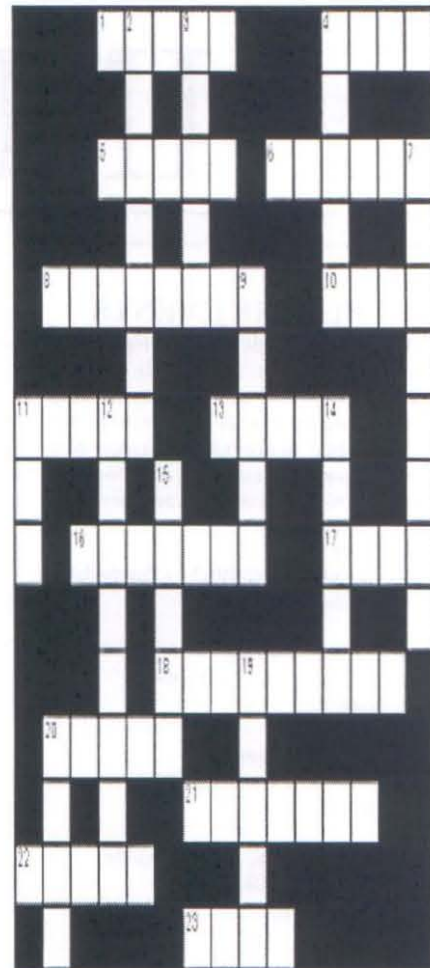
