In a few days now, on Sunday September 5, the IMCZ embarks on its annual Charity Golf Tournament at the Golfpark, Holzhausern.

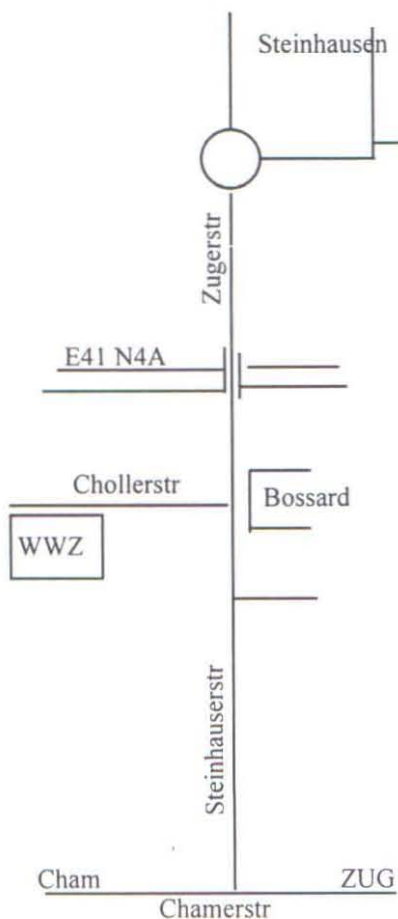

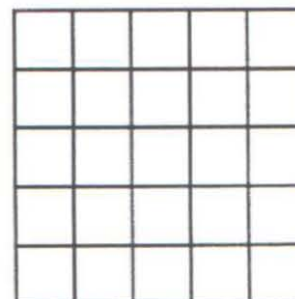
## WELCOME
