FISH HATCHERY

The visit to the Fish Hatchery on Wednesday 21 March was revealing and informative in understanding how the food supply from the Zugersee is maintained.

The history of the Zugersee Fish Hatchery began in 1875 with the aim of maintaining fish stock and to improve fish quality. The current premises were completely rebuilt in 1999 taking advantage of modern technology.

The IMCZ were led through the whole procedure from netting the fish through to restocking the lake with the minimum loss of young fish.

The Zugersee itself is some 40 sq km in size and holds 28 different types of fish.

Turnout for this event was surprisingly modest considering the importance of the local fish industry. Unfortunately some people who registered failed to attend.
