Visit to the



Swiss Military Museum

in

Reuenthal

Saturday, October 29th 2005 at 10:00am.

We are delighted to announce that we have organised a visit to the Swiss Military and Festungs Museum, Full-Reunthal.

The “Festungsmuseum“ (Artillery Fort Museum) in Reuenthal.

This former artillery fort is situated on a ridge adjacent to the village of Reuenthal, opposite Waldshut, a small medieval city on the German side of the river Rhine. Its construction finished in 1939, just in time before World War II broke out. Its main weapons are the two 7.5 cm artillery guns with the mission to prevent a crossing of the river Rhine by enemy forces in the area of the hydro-electric power station complex near Albbruck-Dogern.

The fortification consists of the two main gun caverns and three observation bunkers armed with machine guns for the defence of the fort. The length of the main tunnel linking caverns and observation bunkers as well as the infrastructure part is 210 meters. There is also a 290m connecting rescue tunnel.

The fort was abandoned by the Swiss armed forces in 1989 and, since then, has been run and maintained by the Association. The entire fort is kept in its original state including the full infrastructure compartments for housing approx. 150 military personnel. Besides this, there are exhibitions of weapons and equipment of the Swiss armed forces as well as foreign armies of the 20th century. The large collection of rifles and small arms, again of Swiss and foreign origin, is absolutely unique.

There is also an “underground“ **restaurant** in the fort – named “Barbara“, the patron saint of the artillery, mining and fire workers. In the charming atmosphere of the former canteen of the troops, we can enjoy refreshments and a variety of light food.

There will be a limit of **15 people** for this visit as we have booked a tour in English. The cost for the tour, including lunch, will be **CHF 25.-** per person. Members should arrive at the museum latest **9:45am** and should allow approx. **90 minutes** drive from Zug. Please contact **John Stuart** for further details.
